

SAMUEL CRAWLEY (1705–62): BRITISH CONSUL AT SMYRNA

Notes:

This index is just over 260 lines. In the final version (at <https://www.levantineheritage.com/pdf/Samuel-Crawley-British-Consul-at-Smyrna.pdf>) it is set in three columns and fills just over two pages.

Some minor mentions are omitted, and some individuals with the same surname are collected together into one entry (e.g. ‘Allen family’); where there are also index entries to individuals with that surname, the family entry has been placed first (e.g. Hochepped). Long strings of locators have been avoided where possible, but some strings of six or even seven locators have been allowed, if breaking them down would have needed several lines of subheadings or sub-subheadings.

Some footnotes have been added to the index below to explain indexing decisions.

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Notes: References to illustrations are in italics. Samuel Crawley is abbreviated as SC.

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¹ Married women can be found at both their maiden and married names.

² Boundaries have changed since the 18th century; Aleppo is now in Syria. To avoid over-complicating the index, countries have not been added to place names.

³ Places in Turkey may be looked for under both their 18th-century and their modern names. Main entries are at the old names, with cross-references from the modern names, but this could be done the other way round.

⁴ This is not the only possible way of dealing with this material, but it is important to devise a method that brings together the various references and allows access from varied entry points.

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⁵ A cross-reference from Clotterbooke is unnecessary as it would be adjacent in this index.

⁶ This entry includes individuals who are mentioned only briefly on these pages, thus saving several lines.

⁷ Ambrose is not named on 29 but the references to the two boys clearly refer to Richard and Ambrose.

⁸ ‘his brother’ on 6 clearly refers to John.

⁹ Samuel Crawley is the metatopic. This entry has been kept deliberately short and mostly just follows the section headings in the text.

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¹⁰ The three Sarah Crawleys need more detail to distinguish them in the index.

¹¹ Dates are given here to distinguish him from the other Sir Francis.

¹² This entry covers references both to the Dutch in Turkey and to the Netherlands itself; as there are more of the former it seemed logical to make the main entry here with a cross-reference from 'Netherlands'.

¹³ Some minor mentions of education have been omitted.

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¹⁴ The question mark here indicates uncertainty

¹⁵ This London entry is quite long; it could be shortened, e.g. by collecting together the references to the various livery companies.

¹⁶ These locators are double-entered at ‘Bedfordshire’.

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¹⁷ The first locator could be 22–23 as Sediköy is not actually mentioned till 22.

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¹⁸ This could be considered a passing mention and omitted.
